Waipahu Quick Build **Safety** Project

In partnership with the Department of Transportation Services' Honolulu Complete Streets Program, Better Block Hawaii will bring pedestrian safety improvements to Leoku Street in Waipahu. The goal of the project is to improve roadway safety by increasing visibility of pedestrians, decreasing pedestrian crossing distances, and lowering vehicle speeds. Improvements will be installed in the fall of 2024 and will include painted curb extensions and a pedestrian refuge island at the Leolua Street crossing, with possible improvements also at the Waipahu Street crossing. The project is funded by the Bloomberg Philanthropies Asphalt Art Initiative.



Painted Curb Extensions & Pedestrian Refuge Island



The existing curb extensions along Leoku Street, as well as the pedestrian refuge island at the Leolua Street crossing, will be improved through the addition of delineators and painted murals. New curb extensions may also be installed at the Leolua Street crossing. The street murals will be designed by local artists to reflect the Waipahu community.
